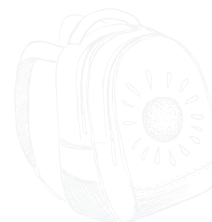

Independent Beginner

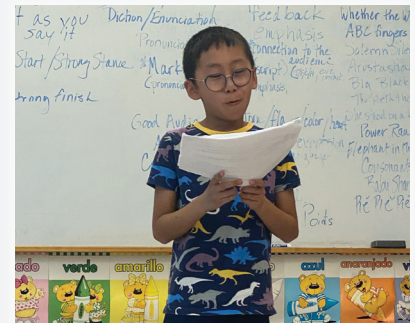
Covers basic water safety, swimming with face in the water, learning to swim independently (with little assistance), introduction of technique, and basic strokes.

Advanced

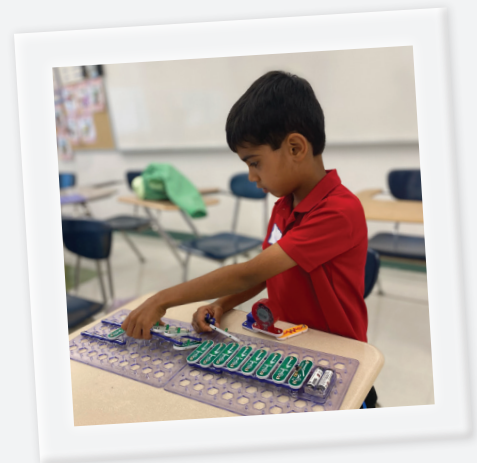

MY CHILD HAS TO MISS A DAY OF CAMP, DO YOU PRORATE CLASSES?

Unfortunately we cannot prorate classes because we pay our instructors, coaches, and counselors by the week.

WHAT AGES DO YOU SERVE IN YOUR CAMPS?

We have camps for rising kindergarten through twelfth grade (your child's grade for Fall 2025). We have opportunities for camp counselors who are 15 years and older AND a rising high school sophomore.

WHO ARE THE CAMP INSTRUCTORS AND WHAT DO COUNSELORS DO?

Our instructors are experts in their particular field with a passion for sharing their unique knowledge with campers. Each adult instructor is supported by one or two counselors (high school or college age). Full-day sports instructors are supported by adult assistant instructors and multiple high school athletes. The number of assistant instructors and counselors is based on enrollment in compliance with HHS camp regulations.

HOW DO YOU CHOOSE THE CAMP LOCATIONS?

All of our camps are centralized in two locations: Newton North High School & Angier Elementary School. This makes our camps more accessible for all students. It also allows us to have excellent staffing coverage and fewer drop off locations for families with more than one child.

WHAT COVID PROTECTION MEASURES DO YOU HAVE IN PLACE?

WILL LUNCH BE PROVIDED FOR YOUR PROGRAMS?

DO YOU OFFER AN EXTENDED DAY PROGRAM?

Unfortunately, not enough families enroll in this option to make it viable. However, we have extended the drop off to start at 8:30am (for morning and full day camps) and pick up to end at 4:00pm (for afternoon and full day camps).

WHY DO YOUR CLASSROOM-BASED PROGRAMS COST MORE THAN YOUR SPORTS CAMPS?

Our classroom-based programs cost more to operate and generally have much smaller class sizes.

MY CHILD DOESN'T ATTEND A NEWTON PUBLIC SCHOOL, CAN THEY STILL ATTEND A CAMP?

Absolutely! Our classes are open to all communities.

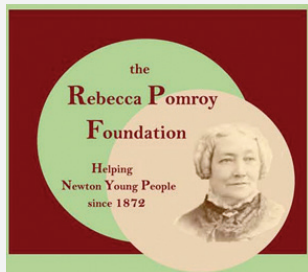

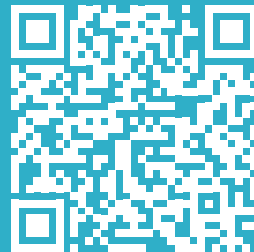
